Meeting called to order by Byrnes followed by Pledge of Allegiance.
23.030-Motion Reiser/Second Keatley to approve today's agenda and minutes from January 9, 10 and 11, 2023 meeting. Motion carried

The following people were present at various times throughout the meeting in person or via Zoom: Joseph Moses – Standard newspaper, Denise Beyer – Auditor and Clerk to Supervisors, Jack Knight, Val Reinke, Trisha Wilkins, Amy Bresnahan, Clark Mellick, Stephanie Runkle, Jim Janett, Ross Geerdes, Chris Fee, Andy Kelleher, Jordan Bacon, Brian Ridenour. Public Comment: Val Reinke updated on ACCF grant application process opening and other upcoming events and meetings.

Trisha Wilkins, CEO of NE lowa Community Action Corp, presented data and programs available through NEICAC. Wilkins explained that COVID funds have made it possible to provide more services/assistance to more people, but funds are beginning to return to pre-COVID funding levels.
