The amendment will change the process for the creation of residential subdivisions in rural Allamakee County for properties zoned A-1, Agricultural District. It will require a Zoning Change to R-1, Rural Residential District for three or more residential lots in one development. It will also include language on a farmhouse split. In situations where an existing farmhouse, incidental to farming, were to be separated from the farm it would be up to the discretion of the County Sanitarian to determine lot size with no lot size being smaller than 1.5 acres or larger than 3 acres.
